

2024 Legislative Overview

During the 2024 legislative session, NMBC opposed anti-business bills that would hurt our state and supported bills that would help. Below is a brief summary:

- 1) Opposing the Paid Family Medical Leave Act (SB 3, HB6);
- 2) Opposing tax increases (HB 252);
- 3) Opposing Rent control (SB 375);
- 4) Opposing environmental laws that increase transportation and other costs (HB 41, SJR 8, HJR 4);
- 5) Supporting legislative approval for emergency orders lasting longer than 60 days (HJR 8);
- 6) Supporting legislation to address crime and the 'catch/release' bail system (SJR 11);
- 7) Opposing State takeover of private sector businesses like Banking (HB 125).

NMBC activated our network of like-minded groups statewide and accomplished nearly 270,000 actions taken in the form of emails and phone calls to legislators. We also provided written and in-person comments to key legislators during the committee hearing process.

Below are the results of our work. Note: Outcomes in green indicate a favorable disposition.
