RE: Support HB 102 Violent Felonies for Meritorious Deduction

Mr./Madame Chair and Committee Members:

The New Mexico Business Coalition (NMBC) represents hundreds of businesses and thousands of New Mexicans. We focus on making New Mexico a better place to live and work, with abundant good-paying jobs to provide for our families.

NMBC supports HB 102 Violent Felonies for Meritorious Deduction. This bill reclassifies homicide by vehicle and great bodily harm by vehicle as serious violent offenses, limiting the ability of offenders to earn meritorious deductions from their sentences. This reform aims to ensure that those convicted of these crimes serve longer sentences, helping to reduce the risk to public safety and address the growing concern over vehicular violence in New Mexico.

By reclassifying homicide by vehicle and great bodily harm by vehicle as serious violent offenses, HB 102 targets crimes that cause significant harm to victims and communities. It ensures that individuals convicted of homicide or causing great bodily harm with a vehicle will spend more time in prison. It limits the opportunity for early release by reducing the number of meritorious deductions they can earn, preventing dangerous offenders from reentering society prematurely.

HB 102 removes ambiguity in sentencing by categorizing vehicular homicide and great bodily harm as serious violent offenses. This addresses the gap identified in *State v. Montano*, ensuring consistent sentencing and reinforcing the justice system's fairness. By treating these crimes as serious violent offenses, HB102 underscores the state's commitment to holding offenders accountable for their actions, reinforcing the message that such crimes will not be tolerated.

This is necessary to reduce crime and increase public safety in New Mexico. By ensuring that offenders convicted of vehicular homicide and great bodily harm serve longer sentences, the bill strengthens accountability, improves sentencing consistency, and helps protect communities from high-risk offenders.

We encourage you to support HB 102 Violent Felonies for Meritorious Deduction and vote 'YES' for its passage.
