On behalf of the **New Mexico Business Coalition**, which represents hundreds of businesses and thousands of working families across our state, I write in strong support of **SB 78 Nuclear Energy Recognized as Renewable Energy**.

SB 78 represents a pragmatic step forward in aligning our state's energy policy with economic realities and business competitiveness.
