
## **Business Spotlight: Caren Cowan and her many ventures**



between. The **Digest** reaches from Hawaii to Maine with a major focus on the West Coast.

From 1997 to 2020 she worked as executive director of the New Mexico Cattle Growers' Association. Caren worked in the same position for the New Mexico Wool Growers, Inc. from
