This survey was conducted from January 31 – February 6, 2025, through a series of online surveys delivered via SMS messages. 541 survey respondents were randomly selected from a demographically proportionate sample of 2025 New Mexico registered voters. Weighted demographics include party, age, geography, ethnicity, and gender. The survey has a ±4.213 % margin of error with a confidence level of 95%.
